LEGAL NOTICE NO. 50 OF 2023

Toll-Gate (Amendment) Regulations, 2023

Pursuant to section 5 of the Toll-Gates Act, 1976¹, I,

RETŠELISITSOE MATLANYANE

Minister responsible for finance and development planning make the following regulations:

Citation and commencement

1. These regulations may be cited as the Toll-Gate (Amendment) Regulations, 2023 and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of April, 2023.

Toll-Gate charge

2. Regulation 3 of the Toll-Gate Regulations, 2001² is amended by deleting subregulation (1) and substituting the following subregulation:

“(1). No vehicle entering Lesotho shall pass through a toll-gate unless its driver has paid a toll-gate charge of -

- (a) M60.00 for Lesotho registered motorcycles and light vehicles designed or adopted for conveyance of people or freight with no heavy axle;
- (b) M80.00 for foreign registered motorcycle and light vehicles designed or adopted for conveyance of people or freight with no heavy axle;
- (c) M100.00 for Lesotho registered medium heavy vehicles designed or adopted for conveyance of people or freight with heavy axle;
- (d) M135.00 for foreign registered medium heavy vehicles designed or adopted for conveyance of people or freight with heavy axle;

- (e) M145.00 for Lesotho registered large heavy vehicles designed or adopted for conveyance of people or freight with 3 axles;
- (f) M200.00 for foreign large heavy vehicles designed or adopted for conveyance of people or freight with 3 axles;
- (g) M340.00 for Lesotho registered extra-large heavy vehicles designed or adopted for conveyance of people or freight with 4 or more axles;
- (h) M470.00 for foreign extra-large heavy vehicles designed or adopted for conveyance of people or freight with 4 or more axles”.

Repeal

3. Toll-Gate (Amendment) Regulations, 2022³ are repealed.
